HOW TO WITNESS A BAPTISM

- **1. With joy and gratitude.** Luke 15:7: "Just so, I tell you, there will be more joy in heaven over one sinner who repents than over ninety-nine righteous persons who need no repentance."
- **2. With prayer for the one being baptized.** We should pray for God's protection, and His power to keep this person believing till the very end. We should ask God to mature this person, grow him or her up in the faith, and make them strong for Christ's sake.
- **3. With warm hospitality towards the one baptized.** Baptism is a way that a person says to other Christians, "I am one of you. Jesus is my Savior too." Therefore, we should receive this new member of Christ's Church into His family with warmth and care.
- **4. With a remembrance of our own baptism, and the declaration we made there.** We need to remember that we have taken a public stand. Therefore, we must always walk accordingly. When faced with a strong temptation, or confronted with a moral issue, this should come to our attention: I have declared myself a follower of Christ. From that day forward, my life reflects on my Savior and His gospel. Therefore, I must do what honors Him.
- **5.** If we are an unbeliever, we should witness a baptism as one who needs its message. Hear Jesus calling you to trust and follow Him. God has saved this person; He can save you too!
- 6. If we are an unbaptized believer, we should witness a baptism as a call for us to follow Christ in obedience. Christians are to publicly declare their faith. Baptism is how we do this.
- **7. With praise unto God.** Ultimately, a baptism is meant to point us to the greatness of God's mercy and love. Our response to any baptism should be praise.
